A developer-built 1980s office block has been converted into a state-of-theart medical practice and, as our judges confirm, the transformation is 'stunning'.

Anticipating a rise in patient numbers triggered by the completion of 2,000 new homes in the area, the brief for converting the building was to improve accessibility and expand its footprint so that the practice could offer new services and an on-site pharmacy.

For reasons of cost, demolition was not an option, and the design responds to the extra spatial requirements by adding a penthouse conference room on the roof, expanding the footprint of the building by a third.

An extra benefit of the extension was the dismantling of the existing frontage, which was replaced with a new facade, notable for its oak curtain walling and 'intelligent glass', which our judges said would give visitors a 'good feeling about visiting this building'.

Internally, the existing steel columns were encased in internal walls, removed or. transformed into colorful features.

In consulting rooms, blinds and curtains (which require refreshing every six months for hygiene reasons) have been replaced with windows, which, at the flick of a switch, can alternate between transparent and opaque.

Sustainability has been addressed by incorporating passive fabric improvements, replacing existing windows and creating cross-ventilation and nighttime cooling. The annual predicted CO₂ emissions are 23.2kg/m².

- A model for how a medical practice can revitalise a vacant, outmoded office block.
- · Bold facade transformation with white render, timber curtain-walling, entrance canopy and glazed ground floor.
- Infilling of original L-shaped plan and discrete rooftop pavilion increase floor area by over one-third.
- Cost-conscious approach to enhancing existing features, such as new car for lift.
- Rigorous handling of existing columns and bulkheads.
